Trinity Sunday is the patronal feast of our parish, which is dedicated to the Holy Trinity, Almighty God himself, 'one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance.' Let us ask the Lord to bless our parish, our schools, and the wider community that we are called to serve in our daily lives. As disciples, we are all responsible for the Church's mission and to be the presence of Christ in our community, so let us ask him for the grace to be his Church here in North East Lincolnshire.

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for June: That priests, through the modesty & humility of their lives, may commit themselves actively to a solidarity with those who are most poor.

Cycle of Prayer: During the summer of Ordinary Time, we pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, Deacon Richard, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of our parish schools, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

CARE: Deacon Stephen would like to ask all parishioners to keep CARE in their prayers over the next few days, especially this **Wednesday, 19th June 2019**, when the National Lottery Community Fund will make their decision on CARE's recent bid for continuation funding, which would enable CARE to house & support homeless people & other vulnerable groups in our borough, support on which hundreds of local people rely.

Day for Life – 16th June 2019: God created all people in his image and the Day for Life is celebrated each year in the Catholic Church in England, Ireland, Scotland & Wales to raise awareness about the meaning & value of all human life from conception to resurrection. This year, we are asked to reflect on domestic abuse. Men, women and children suffer domestic abuse at the hands of husbands, wives, parents & other family members; in England, one in four women and one in six men suffer from domestic abuse in their lifetime, and two women are killed every week by a partner or ex-partner. Violence of this kind can never be tolerated or justified as it is an offence against the God-given dignity of every human person. There will be a second collection this weekend to support the Church's promotion of the dignity of the human person.

Refugee Week 2019: In response to the Holy Father's prayer intention this month, Fr Andrew will be taking the Ration Challenge this week and eating the same rations as a Syrian refugee in Jordan & Lebanon for Refugee Week. Our faith calls us to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked, welcome the stranger, and visit the sick & imprisoned, for however we treat our brothers & sisters, we treat Christ Jesus (*Matthew 25:31-46*).
