Deanery News: Bishop Patrick has made a number of pastoral appointments concerning our deanery with effect from 14th September 2019. Canon Geoffrey Hunton has been appointed parish priest of the four parishes of St Norbert, Crowle, St Thomas of Canterbury, Gainsborough, Holy Souls, Scunthorpe & St Bernadette, Scunthorpe, and Fr Liam Carpenter has been appointed assistant priest in the same parishes. Mgr Thomas McGovern is moving from Scunthorpe to Melton Mowbray in Leicestershire and Fr Neil Peoples to Swadlincote & Burton-upon-Trent in Staffordshire & Derbyshire. We welcome Canon Geoffrey and thank Mgr McGovern and Fr Neil for their ministry here in northern Lincolnshire. Please pray for these four priests and those whom they serve; there will be a certain amount of restructuring & upheaval in Scunthorpe, Crowle & Gainsborough and I know that our prayers will be welcome. EU Settlement Scheme: The United Kingdom is due to leave the European Union on 31st October 2019, with or without an agreement governing this departure and the ongoing future relationship between the UK & the EU. The Catholic Church in England and Wales stands in solidarity with all EU citizens who have made their home here, many of whom are an integral and valued part of our parishes, schools and communities, including here in North East Lincolnshire. The Church has experienced first-hand the extensive contribution that people from across Europe have made to our society and recognises the evidence that immigration from the rest of Europe, and from further

afield, has not undermined opportunities for British citizens, but rather has brought considerable economic and social benefits. However, the law concerning the free movement of people will be changing as a result of decisions taken since the referendum on the UK's membership of the EU, and **EU, EEA & Swiss citizens must apply to the settlement scheme** if they are to protect their existing rights and place in our society. British citizens & Irish citizens do not need to apply. There is no charge for applying to this scheme. Please visit gov.uk/settled-status-eu-citizens-families for more information.
