- Christ is risen! Let us continue to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, in particular by taking part in our parish liturgies and devotions; you will need *Season of Easter 2020*, which includes the hymns we will sing during Sunday Mass, the source and summit of our week, the Act of Spiritual Communion and *Regina Caeli* which we pray at every Mass, and the noontime prayers which are said each day. There will be no livestreamed liturgies on Mondays from Monday 1st June.
- Next Sunday is the **Solemnity of Pentecost**; please gather for the Vigil Mass on Saturday at 7.00 pm, for Mass during the Day on Sunday at 10.00 am, and for Holy Hour on Sunday at 7.00 pm. A liturgy leaflet will be emailed with next Sunday's bulletin, which you will need for Mass & Holy Hour.

Stay at home – Protect the NHS – Save lives

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for May: That deacons, faithful in their service to the Word and to the poor, may be an invigorating symbol for the entire Church.

Cycle of Prayer – Easter: We pray for: new members of the Church; vocations; human work; the right use of the media; and the Church. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, all those who are working to protect us, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

The Diocese of Nottingham is seeking to appoint a Director of Communications to work with the Bishop of Nottingham and the parishes, chaplaincies and schools of the Diocese to lead the development and implementation of an effective communications framework across the Diocese, promoting the diocesan vision and mission, and the three themes of encounter, discipleship and missionary discipleship. Keeping Patients and Loved Ones connected via Video Calls: At the moment, it is not ordinarily possible to visit loved ones who are in hospital, and so the patient experience team in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital is helping loved ones keep in touch during these times. Loved ones can contact the via their email address and they will arrange to set up a video call. Keeping in touch is so important for any patient during these times whilst visiting has been suspended in hospitals, especially so for patients receiving end-of-life care, for whom face-to-face contact is immeasurable. Mental Health Awareness Week concludes today, this year, its observance has been more important than ever as we find ourselves faced with a global health crisis which is undoubtedly having an enormous impact on the mental health of many people.

We can see in our borough the tremendous kindness pouring forth from so many people day in, day out, from small acts of generosity between neighbours and phone calls among friends to the dedication and commitment of those working to serve the wider community, in health and social care, in the emergency services, in our schools, our supermarkets and in other settings as well. But the emergency period is taking its toll on many of those who place themselves in harm's way to protect others, those who are cut off from physical contact with their loved ones, both relatives and friends, and those who may be isolated even though they understand that this is for their own physical wellbeing and that of others, including their loved ones.

Let us ask the Holy Spirit, who is alive in all people, to give us the help that we need to continue to look after the mental health of those whom we care for, let us pray for all who are

struggling with mental health, especially during this challenging time, and let us be thankful for those who care enough for us to listen to us without judgment and challenge us with compassion, as they help us to be the people we have been called to be. Fr Andrew
