In Ordinary Time**

- Today is the **Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ**, in which Christ Jesus 'the head of the Church, which is his body, the fulness of him who fills the whole creation' is with us 'always, yes to the end of time': 'Nourishing your faithful by this sacred mystery, you make them holy, so that the human race, bounded by one world, may be enlightened by one faith and united by one bond of charity.'

- Livestreamed liturgies are available on demand on Fr Andrew's YouTube channel shortly after they have finished.
- The Government has given its permission for churches and other places of worship to open for individual prayer. **All being well, St Mary on the Sea Church will open for individual prayer this coming Friday, 19th June 2020, the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, between 2.00 & 5.00 pm, provided this can be done safely and lawfully.**
- Corpus Christi Church and Our Lady Star of the Sea Church remain closed for the time being, as does the parish office, and will remain so until they can be safely opened; to speak to Fr Andrew, please telephone St Mary's Presbytery (01472 342301) and leave a message on the answerphone or email fatherandrew@holyltrinitygci.uk

Stay safe – Control the virus – Save lives

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for June: That all those who suffer may find their way in life, allowing themselves to be touched by the Heart of Jesus.

Cycle of Prayer – Ordinary Time: We pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, all those who are working to protect us, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

The Faithful Departed: Please pray for Siobhan Rooney, whose Committal took place in Grimsby Crematorium on Tuesday 9th June at 10.30 am; and her family and friends who mourn their loss.

Noontime Prayers: All are welcome to gather for noontime prayers every day except Monday to pray for the sick and housebound and all who care for them, and say the Angelus, the Prayer for England and our Parish Daily Prayer during the Pandemic. On Fridays, we are joined by the staff and pupils of our schools.

Opening of St Mary on the Sea Church: The Government has announced that churches and other places of worship can open for individual prayer in line with social distancing legislation and guidance, provided that this can be done safely, and preparations are being made for St Mary on the Sea Church, which is normally open during the week, to open on Tuesdays between 5.00 & 8.00 pm, Wednesdays between 2.00 & 5.00 pm and Fridays between 2.00 & 5.00 pm, beginning this coming Friday, 19th June 2020, the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This decision does not mean that the sacred liturgy, such as Mass or Holy Hour, can be celebrated while the church is open, and so the opening hours will respect the timetable that we already have, but the Government will continue to work with the Churches and other faith traditions towards the full reopening of places of worship as soon as the scientific advice allows. It does mean, though, that we can come to pray before the Blessed Sacrament and relax in our sacred space.

For this to happen safely, two stewards will need to be on duty to welcome people during each session and to support people in following the social distancing and sanitising guidelines within the church. This will be a hugely valuable service to the community as we endeavour to minimise the risk of infection spread and make the church as safe as possible for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. If you are considering volunteering, you should be 18+, in good health and any members of your household should also be consulted. If you are interested in helping, please email office@holyltrinitygci.uk or ring 01472 342301, and provide your name and a contact email address and telephone number. By volunteering, you are confirming that you meet legal requirements and guidance concerning your own health. Training will be provided on how we keep the church clean and safe for volunteers and those who come into our churches, and a detailed risk assessment will be completed and submitted to the Diocese for approval before I can receive final permission to open the church.

A maximum of fifty people will be permitted in the church at any given time; everyone should sanitise their hands when they come into and leave the church, and they should follow the stewards' instructions and guidance.

The banner of Our Lord's Sacred Heart which has been placed in the sanctuary for June has beneath it the words 'O Jesus, open wide thy heart' – a beautiful prayer which reminds us of the all-embracing and all-inclusive love of God made human in Christ; in Baptism and the Eucharist, we are 'bathed in the sweetness' of God's grace, so that we can open wide our hearts to God and one another. Between Tuesdays and Sundays each week, I lead our wonderful parish family in prayer for everyone who has been affected by the coronavirus pandemic has affected us all in different ways – the sick and the dying, the isolated and the afraid, those who serve the wider community with generosity of heart, and all who are responsible for the common good. During this time, many of us have learned not to take so much for granted, and to think anew about who and what matters most, including our communion with God, with one another and within ourselves. Food builds community, and as we celebrate today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us pray that as we can now gather before the Blessed Sacrament we will be able to gather, as the Body of Christ, around the Altar, the table of our parish family, to feast on that love so that we may grow in love.
