Stay alert – Control the virus – Save lives

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for July: That today's families may be accompanied with love, respect and guidance.

Cycle of Prayer – Ordinary Time: We pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, all those who are working to protect us, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

CAFOD has joined the Disasters Emergencies Committee in helping millions of people whose lives are at risk, as coronavirus spreads throughout refugee camps and countries suffering conflict, civil disorder and natural disasters. You can donate to CAFOD's relief effort at cafod.org.uk/coronavirus; your generous contribution will help CAFOD to respond to the challenge that the spread of coronavirus has brought to some of the most vulnerable people on earth.

Celebrating Sunday Mass: Anyone wishing to enter the ballot for 11.00 am Mass next Sunday, 2nd August 2020, please email or telephone the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk) during office hours on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday this week, indicating how many seats you would like to reserve for you and members of your own household; you will be contacted on Friday with the outcome. Only those whose names are drawn in the ballot can be admitted, up to a maximum of 50, and there will be a reserve list in case someone drops out. **The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended.** All liturgies celebrated in St Mary on the Sea Church will continue to be livestreamed so that as many parishioners as possible can gather as 'one body, one spirit in Christ'.

Celebrating Weekday Mass: Admission to church for weekday Mass is on a first-come, first-served basis up to a maximum of 50 attendees.

Coming into Church: Whether you are coming to church for Mass or for private individual prayer, please bear in mind that social distancing must be observed in the car park and in the church itself, which means that a maximum of 50 people can be in the church for Mass, all of whom must wear face coverings while in church. For baptisms, weddings and funerals, the maximum is 30, with admittance by prior arrangement, and for private individual prayer it is 35; face coverings do not need to be worn for these as a social distance of 2m can be maintained. Stewards will guide those coming into the church; no one who is displaying symptoms of Covid-19 or any other transmissible illness should come into the church; under 16s must be accompanied by an adult; people from different households should not share lifts; care should be taken in the car park to avoid close contact with other vehicles and their occupants; you will have to sign in and leave a contact number which may be required by NHS Test & Trace; and toilet facilities will not be available. Thank you for your cooperation as we implement guidance issued by HM Government and the Bishops of England & Wales, which help us to value, serve and love all in the name of Jesus the Christ.

The Faithful Departed: Please pray for: Warwick Lydon, whose Funeral will be celebrated in St Mary on the Sea Church on Wednesday 29th July at 11.30 am prior to committal in Scartho Road Cemetery; and his family and friends who mourn their loss.

First Holy Communion: Parents of children who will be in Year 3 or above in school year 2020-2021 and who would like their children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Blessed Eucharist next year should complete an application form, available from the stewards' table in St Mary on the Sea Church when it is open, and hand it directly to Fr Andrew after Mass by Sunday 13th September 2020. Parents and carers of children who were due to make their First Confession and receive their First Holy Communion this year have been contacted about their children's eventual reception of these sacraments, since current Government guidance on social distancing means that it is not possible for there to be a single celebration of Mass during which First Holy Communion is received.

Mass Intentions: Asking for Mass to be offered for a specific intention is a beautiful way of asking our parish family to pray for that intention and supporting the mission of the Church in our parish. A list of those Mass intentions that were applied while our parish churches were closed for public worship has been placed in the porch of St Mary. All Mass intentions which have been submitted and which have not yet been applied will be applied in due course, although it may not be possible for them to be applied on the day, at the time and in the church requested. Sunday Mass will be offered for all the people of our parish (*Missa pro populo*), which every parish priest is obliged to do each Sunday and holyday of obligation. Thank you for your understanding.

Supporting Our Parish: Thank you to everyone who is generous in supporting our parish financially even when our parish churches have been closed. From St Oscar Romero: 'People are free to choose the political system they want but not free to do whatever they feel like. They will have to be judged by God's justice in the political or social system they choose. God is the judge of all social systems. Neither the Gospel nor the Church can be monopolised by any political or social movement. I don't want to be an 'anti', against anybody. I simply want to be the builder of a great affirmation: the affirmation of God, who loves us and who wants to save us. To each one of us Christ is saying: If you want your life and mission to be fruitful like mine, do as I do. Be converted into a seed that lets itself be buried. Let yourself be killed. Do not be afraid. Those who shun suffering will remain alone. No one is more alone than the selfish. But if you give your life out of love for others, as I give mine for all, you will reap a great harvest. You will have the deepest satisfactions.'
