Stay alert – Control the virus – Save lives

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for August: We pray for all those who work and live from the sea, among them sailors, fishermen and their families.

Cycle of Prayer – Ordinary Time: We pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, all those who are working to protect us, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Celebrating Sunday Mass: If you wish to enter the ballot for 11.00 am Mass next Sunday, 16th August 2020, please email or telephone the parish office (office@holyltrinitygci.uk; 01472 342301) during office hours on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday this week, indicating how many seats you would like to reserve for you and members of your own household; you will be contacted on Friday with the outcome. Only those whose names are drawn in the ballot can be admitted, up to a maximum of 50 attendees, and there will be a reserve list in case someone drops out. **The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended.**

Celebrating Weekday Mass: Admission to church for weekday Mass and Celebrations of Word & Holy Communion is on a first-come, first-served basis up to a maximum of 50 attendees.

Coming into Church: Whether you are coming to church for Mass or for private individual prayer, please bear in mind that social distancing must be observed in the car park and in the church itself, which means that a maximum of 50 people can be in the church for Mass; for baptisms, weddings and funerals, the maximum is 30, with admittance by prior arrangement. **From this weekend, face coverings must be worn in church whether for liturgical celebrations or private individual prayer.** Stewards will guide those coming into the church; no one who is displaying symptoms of Covid-19 or any other transmissible illness should come into the church; under 16s must be accompanied by an adult; people from different households should not share lifts; care should be taken in the car park to avoid close contact with other vehicles and their occupants; you will have to sign in and leave a contact number which may be required by NHS Test & Trace; and toilet facilities will not be available. Thank you for your cooperation as we implement guidance issued by Her Majesty's Government and the Bishops of England & Wales, which help us to value, serve and love all in the name of Jesus the Christ. All liturgies celebrated in St Mary on the Sea Church will be livestreamed so that as many parishioners as possible can gather as 'one body, one spirit in Christ'.

Face Coverings are mandatory in places of worship from this weekend, and so should be worn in church for liturgical celebrations and private individual prayer by all those who are attending churches unless they are exempt from doing so, such as they are under the age of eleven, are not able to put on, wear or remove a face covering because of a physical or mental illness or impairment, or disability, or if putting on, wearing or removing a face covering will cause them severe

distress. During Mass, the Celebrant will not have to wear a face covering if he can remain at least 2m from the congregation, but he must wear one for Holy Communion, which has been my practice since St Mary on the Sea Church reopened. This instruction from HM Government is for the good of all who gather in our churches as they are enclosed public spaces in which people can gather from differing households, and it is enforceable by law. Wearing face coverings asks us to reflect upon what we can do to reduce the chances of passing on or contracting the virus as a practical fulfilment of Our Lord's command to 'Love your neighbour as yourself' (*Matthew 22:39*).
