I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.'

**Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for September:** We pray that the planet's resources will not be plundered but shared in a just and respectful manner.

**Cycle of Prayer:** During the autumn of Ordinary Time, we pray for: the harvest, the fruits of human work and the reverent use of Creation; students and teachers; the spread of the Gospel; justice and peace in the world; prisoners and their families; all victims of war; and young people. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick and housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, all who are working to protect us, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

**Celebrating Sunday Mass:** Please visit [massbooking.uk](http://massbooking.uk) to book your place at Mass next weekend; there are forty places available in Immingham, fifty-five in Cleethorpes and fifty in Grimsby, all on a first-come, first served basis. If you do not have access to the internet, please telephone the parish office for assistance with booking. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended.

**Celebrating Weekday Mass:** Admission to St Mary on the Sea Church for weekday Mass is on a first-come, first-served basis up to a maximum of fifty attendees.

**Coming into Church:** Whether you are coming to church for Mass or for private individual prayer, please bear in mind that social distancing must be observed in the car park and in the church itself, which means that a maximum of fifty people can be in the church for Mass; for baptisms the maximum is six, and for weddings and funerals it is thirty, with admittance by prior arrangement. **Face coverings must be worn in church unless someone is exempt.** Stewards will guide those coming into the church and ensure that they are seated safely; no one who is displaying symptoms of Covid-19 or any other transmissible illness should come into the church; under 16s must be accompanied by an adult; people from different households should not share lifts; care should be taken in the car park to avoid close contact with other vehicles and their occupants; you will have to sign in and leave a contact number which may be required by NHS Test and Trace; and toilet facilities will not be available other than in cases of medical emergency. Thank you for your cooperation as we implement guidance issued by Her Majesty's Government and the Bishops of England & Wales, which help us to value, serve and love all in the name of Jesus the Christ. All liturgies celebrated in St Mary on the Sea Church are livestreamed so that as many parishioners as possible can gather as 'one body, one spirit in Christ'.

**Christmas Draw:** Unfortunately, the 'rule of six' and the uncertainty caused by the ongoing pandemic means that we will not be able to have a Christmas fayre or Christmas lunch this year or any other social events for the foreseeable future as we all play our part. Our social gatherings are important because they bring us together and help raise much needed funds for our parish – which means that we need the Christmas draw more than ever! Please take and sell raffle tickets, which are available from the back of each church and which can also be posted or collected from the parish office. Prizes can be left at the back of each church or

if you would like to contribute money for a prize, please pop it in an envelope and place it in the collection basket.

**The Faithful Departed:** Please pray for: Susan Mary Raithby, whose Funeral will be celebrated in St Mary on the Sea Church on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> October at 10.30 am prior to committal in Grimsby Crematorium; Malcolm Walker, whose Funeral Mass will be celebrated in Corpus Christi Church on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> October at 1.00 pm prior to committal in Cleethorpes Cemetery; and their family and friends who mourn their loss. The law says that no more than thirty people may attend a funeral until further notice, and so admittance will be by prior arrangement.

**Marriage** is a lifelong vocation of a man and a woman to a community of life and love open to children, and, between the baptised, it is a sacrament. Aware of the many pressures today which can endanger family life, the Church is constantly concerned to make sure that those who are planning to marry are prepared as well as possible. It is important that a couple go to see their parish priest in good time before their wedding – normally, at least six months' notice should be given so that marriage preparation can be arranged. Catholics are reminded of their obligation to preserve their faith and to do all they can within the unity of their partnership to have all their children baptised and brought up in the faith and practice of the Catholic Church; non-Catholic partners will be informed of this promise, but they are not asked to make this or any similar promise. Dispensation for a marriage between a Catholic and a non-Catholic to take place in a non-Catholic Church can only be granted for a serious reason, and couples who wish to marry in a non-Catholic Church should discuss the matter with their priest in good time before their wedding day to see whether a dispensation could be granted. All couples marrying these days need the support of the local Church. In this way they will be strengthened in their preparation for marriage, in celebrating their marriage, and in living out their covenant with one another. We wish to thank all those married people who show such constancy and fidelity to their vocation of marriage. May their example inspire those planning to marry in the Church.
