Act of Spiritual Communion – if you are celebrating Mass online, you may wish to offer this prayer when the Celebrant has said the Communion Antiphon: 'My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.'

Wash hands – Cover face – Make space

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for October: We pray that by the virtue of Baptism, the laity, especially women, may participate more in areas of responsibility in the Church.

Cycle of Prayer: During the autumn of Ordinary Time, we pray for: the harvest, the fruits of human work and the reverent use of Creation; students and teachers; the spread of the Gospel; justice and peace in the world; prisoners and their families; all victims of war; and young people. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick and housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, all who are working to protect us, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

CAFOD Harvest Family Fast Day – 9th October 2020: Please place your offering for CAFOD in the collection basket as you leave church this weekend.

Celebrating Sunday Mass: Please visit massbooking.uk to book your place at Mass next weekend; there are forty places available in Immingham, fifty-five in Cleethorpes and fifty in Grimsby, all on a first-come, first served basis. If you do not have access to the internet, please telephone the parish office for assistance with booking. The obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended.

Celebrating Weekday Mass: Admission to St Mary on the Sea Church for weekday Mass is on a first-come, first-served basis up to a maximum of fifty attendees, other than for Funeral Masses where the maximum is thirty by prior arrangement with the funeral director.

Coming into Church: Whether you are coming to church for Mass or for private individual prayer, **social distancing and the 'rule of six' must be observed in the car park and in our churches.** Your contact details, whether from booking online or signing in, may be required by NHS Test and Trace – please use the QR codes on display if you can. A maximum of fifty people can be admitted in St Mary on the Sea Church, fifty-five in Corpus Christi Church and forty in Our Lady Star of the Sea Church; for baptisms the maximum is six, for weddings it is fifteen and for funerals it is thirty, with admittance by prior arrangement. Stewards are on duty whenever our churches are open. Face coverings must, by law, be worn in church unless someone is exempt. No one who is displaying symptoms of Covid-19 or any other transmissible illness should come into our churches. Under-16s must be accompanied by an adult and must be accompanied to the Altar to receive Holy Communion or a blessing and not just sent forward. People from different households should not share lifts. Care should be taken in the car park to avoid close contact with other vehicles and their occupants. Unfortunately, toilet facilities are not available other than in cases of medical emergency. If you have booked a place but cannot attend, please cancel your booking online or, if the booking period has closed, by contacting the parish office and leaving a message. Thank you for your cooperation.

Christmas Draw: Please take and sell raffle tickets, which are available from the back of each church and which can also be posted or collected from the parish office. Prizes can be left at the back of each church or if you would like to contribute money for a prize, please pop it in an envelope marked 'for raffle prizes' and place it in the collection basket.

As we have not been able to hold fayres and other social events this year, this is our only opportunity to raise funds for the parish and enable our outreach to continue.

Parish Finance Committee: I am delighted that Chris Mack has become Parish Treasurer. I chair the Parish Finance Committee, whose members are appointed by the parish priest to assist him in administering the temporal goods of the parish, and its other members are Deacon Stephen, Rachel Abba, Michael Ducey and Paula Weston. I am grateful to Karin Lund, Maggie Newton and Marie-Therese Shennan, previously parish treasurer, all of whom stepped down earlier this year, to Paula and Rachel for joining the committee, and to Deacon Stephen, Chris and Mike for their ongoing commitment to the parish, along with Linda Halloran, our parish bookkeeper. I am pleased that we have a strong committee going forward, especially in this most challenging of financial years. A summary of the accounts for FY 2019-2020 will be distributed once the committee has been able to review them properly, although there obviously cannot be any form of annual meeting, which will continue to begin with the celebration of Mass but will have a more meaningful and inclusive format in the future, while current restrictions are in force. Pastoral Visits: Coronavirus is at a high or rising level throughout the United Kingdom. Nevertheless, provided that it is safe and legal for him to do so, Fr Andrew will always visit parishioners in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, other care settings or their own homes if they are seriously ill or if they wish to see him to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick and the Blessed Eucharist. He is currently trying to see everyone who would normally be visited by ministers of Holy Communion, especially those who have not received Holy Communion for some time, and he is happy to visit anyone who wishes to see him. World Mission Sunday – 18th October 2020: Next weekend, every parish throughout the world is asked by the Holy Father to pray and give a monetary gift in support of the young Churches through the Universal Solidarity Fund, the Pope's official organisation for overseas mission. We're all called to share God's love by building a future of hope for all people. There will be a second collection next weekend for the Pontifical Missionary Societies, which support Churches living and growing in challenging situations; please leave your offering in the basket as you leave church. Many parishes and other Catholic organisations, whose outreach is dependent on the generosity of the faithful, are experiencing severe financial difficulties as a result of the ongoing pandemic; if this is true about us here in the United Kingdom, it is certainly true in countries such as Kenya, where priests are unable to celebrate Mass at the moment, and are therefore unable to receive Mass offerings – Missio is not only supporting its own outreach but is also supporting them to stop them from going hungry, but can only do so if we support them. So please be generous to next Sunday's second collection so that we can make a real difference to the lives of some of our brothers and sisters in the poorest part of our common home. Fr Andrew
