Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for November: We pray that the progress of robotics and artificial intelligence may always serve humankind.

Cycle of Prayer: During the autumn of Ordinary Time, we pray for: the harvest, the fruits of human work and the reverent use of Creation; students and teachers; the spread of the Gospel; justice and peace in the world; prisoners and their families; all victims of war; and young people. We also pray for Fr Colum, Fr Tony, the sick and housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, all who are working to protect us, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Annual Blessings of Graves will, pending further advice, take place at 2.00 pm next Sunday, 8th November 2020, at Scartho Road Cemetery with Fr Andrew, Cleethorpes Cemetery with Deacon Stephen and Mill Lane Cemetery with Deacon Richard. The ongoing pandemic means that it will not be lawful for us to gather and process together for the blessings this year, but if you would like to stand near your relative's grave, Fr Andrew or the deacons will come towards you, bless the grave and move on. If you would like the clergy to visit one of the other cemeteries, please contact the parish office to arrange a mutually convenient time and date.

Catholic Diaries for 2021 are for sale at the stewards' tables in all our churches. They cost £4.00 each; please place your money in the collection basket as you leave church.

Celebrating Mass: From this coming Thursday, 5th November, until Wednesday 2nd December, places of worship will be closed for most public liturgical celebrations, although they can open for private individual prayer. During that period, all liturgies will only be celebrated online – please visit the parish's website, www.holytrinitygci.uk, for more information. There will be further information in next week's *Sunday Message* about when St Mary on the Sea Church will be open for private individual prayer during this time.

Christmas Draw: As we have not been able to hold social events since March, our annual Christmas draw is our only opportunity to raise funds for the parish and enable our outreach to continue, so please support the raffle:

The draw will be streamed online on Sunday 22nd November.

Pastoral Visits: Coronavirus is at a high or rising level throughout the United Kingdom, and the local alert level in our borough is currently in tier 2, from Saturday 31st October, and all of England will be under the further

restrictions announced by the Prime Minister this Saturday from Thursday 5th November until Wednesday 2nd December. Nevertheless, in accordance with Government guidance, Fr Andrew will always, in so far as it is safe and legal for him to do so, visit parishioners in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, other care settings or their own homes if they are seriously ill and need to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick and the Blessed Eucharist ('the last rites'), but other pastoral visits by him or any other ministers are suspended until further notice. Please contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk) to arrange for him to visit; we need to keep a record of all such visits in case details are required by NHS Test and Trace.

Remembering the Faithful Departed: Cards for you to write the names of your loved ones so that they can be remembered at Mass during November are available in each church; completed cards will be placed before the Altar in St Mary on the Sea Church this Monday, 2nd November, All Souls' Day, when we will celebrate Mass for all the Faithful Departed, at 7.00 pm, and will remain there for November.

Remembrance Sunday – 8th November 2020: Mass next Sunday morning, which will be celebrated online only, will begin five minutes earlier than usual, at 10.55 am, so that two minutes' silence can be observed at 11.00 am prompt. A liturgy leaflet for Mass will be distributed with next week's *Sunday Message*.

Stella Maris: We cannot have the shoebox appeal as usual this year, but if you would like to donate boxes of chocolates so that we can give some festive cheer at Christmas to our seafarers, to whom we owe so much, please leave them at the back of each church. If you would prefer to give a cash donation to support seafarers locally, please place your offering in an envelope and leave it in the collection basket as you leave church; cheques can be made payable to **Holy Trinity GCI RCP**. In it, Fr Colum draws us into the lives of seafarers and details how freight ships are the lifeblood of industry and essential to our national economy, and he gives a fascinating insight into the hugely important role played by the priests, lay chaplains and ship visitors who work for Stella Maris.

From Pope Francis: 'Today's Solemnity of All Saints reminds us that we are all called to holiness. The Saints of all times, whom today we celebrate all together, are not simply symbols, distant, unreachable human beings. Rather, they are people who lived with their feet on the ground; they experienced the daily toil of existence with its successes and failures, finding in the Lord the strength to rise again and again, and to continue their journey. From this we can understand that holiness is a goal that cannot be achieved only through one's own strengths, but rather it is the fruit of God's grace and of our free response to it. The seed of holiness is Baptism. Holiness is living in full communion with God, now already, during this earthly pilgrimage.'
