Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for May: We pray for all young people, called to live life to the fullest; **may** they see in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment, the courage that faith generates, and the dedication to service.

Cycle of Prayer: During the Season of Easter, we pray for: new members of the Church; vocations; human work; the right use of the media; and the Church. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Reclaim our Common Home – 9th May 2021: CAFOD is organising this event on Sunday 9th May between 6.00 & 7.00 pm, and it is open to everyone across its North East Region, namely the dioceses of Hallam, Hexham & Newcastle, Middlesbrough, Leeds & Nottingham. With Pentecost approaching and the Spirit of the season moving us to act, it is an opportunity for us to engage with our campaigning work. We will use the format of the Pastoral Cycle – See, Judge & Act – to discuss how Pentecost inspires action:

- We have met Abdella and seen how his life and the lives of many others are affected by water poverty;
- We will reflect on and judge why this is the case; what is the cause; how can this be changed; how does our faith guide and direct us to work for this change?
- We will recognise where we can take action and inspire our friends and church/ school communities to join us in our Reclaim our Common Home campaign, especially as the UK prepares to host the G7 and COP26 meetings.

So, will you join us on Sunday 9th May as we continue our journey together? Please register for the event using the active Eventbrite link at fb.m/e/1mTQucR3H and you will receive an email invite to the Zoom meeting nearer to the time.

Celebrating Mass: Please visit massbooking.uk as early in the week as possible to book your place for Sunday Mass; please contact the parish office by email or by telephoning and leaving a voicemail if you need assistance and remember to cancel your booking if you cannot come so that your seat can be reallocated. Admission to weekday Mass, other liturgical celebrations and private individual prayer is on a first-come, first-served basis up to a maximum of fifty attendees, other than for funerals, where there is a statutory maximum of admission of thirty and admission is by prior arrangement with the funeral director. All liturgies in St Mary on the Sea Church are livestreamed. More information is available in each church, online and from the parish office.

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is celebrated the fortieth day after Easter Sunday, and it is usually a holyday of obligation. This year, it will be celebrated on Thursday 13th May:

Weds 12 th May 7.00	Vigil Mass in Grimsby
Thurs 10 th May 9.30	Mass during the Day in Grimsby
7.00	Holy Hour online

The liturgies will be in St Mary on the Sea Church so that they can be livestreamed and our two parish schools will join us online for Mass during the day, hence the slightly earlier time.

Pastoral Visits: As you know, the 'stay at home' rule ended on 29th March 2021, but many restrictions remain in place, particularly when it comes to contact inside. People should continue to work from home where they can and minimise the number of journeys they make where possible, avoiding travel at the busiest times and routes. As part of Step 3 of the roadmap out of lockdown here in England, the Government has said that 'no earlier than 17th May, the Government will look to continue easing limits on seeing friends and family wherever possible, allowing people to decide on the appropriate level of risk for their circumstances', and I hope that pastoral visits by ministers of Holy Communion can resume from around that date. In the meantime, provided that it is safe and lawful for me to do so, I will always see parishioners in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, other care settings, their own homes or St Mary's Presbytery if they are seriously ill, or due to be admitted to hospital, and would like to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick, but other regular pastoral visits by me and by other ministers in our parish remain suspended. You should not wait until someone's death is imminent before contacting me lest I be simply unable to visit someone who is sick or dying in good time. If you or a relative are in hospital, please ask a nurse to ask switchboard to contact the Catholic chaplain; if you or a relative are in other care settings, please ask a member of staff to contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk); if you or a relative are at home, please contact the parish office. We need to keep a record of all such visits in case details are required by NHS Test and Trace. Thank you for your cooperation, which keeps us all safe. Fr Andrew
