Act of Spiritual Communion – when you are celebrating Mass online, please offer this prayer with the Celebrant once he has chanted the Communion Antiphon: 'My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.'

Hands – Face – Space – Fresh Air

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for May: We pray for all young people, called to live life to the fullest, that they may see in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment, the courage that faith generates and the dedication to service.

Cycle of Prayer: During the summer of Ordinary Time, we pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Celebrating Mass: Please visit massbooking.uk as early in the week as possible to book your place for Sunday Mass; please contact the parish office by email or by telephoning and leaving a voicemail if you need assistance and remember to cancel your booking if you cannot come so that your seat can be reallocated. Admission to weekday Mass, other liturgical celebrations and private individual prayer is on a first come, first-served basis other than for funerals at which the church's maximum number applies and admission is by prior arrangement. Toilet facilities are available for emergency use. All liturgies in St Mary on the Sea Church are livestreamed. More information is available in each church, online and from the parish office.

Covid-19: England moved into step three of the roadmap out of lockdown last Monday, 17th May; as a result, we have been able to make the following adjustments:

- During Sunday Mass, the Prayer of the Faithful will once again be read by the reader, and our offerings of bread and wine will be brought in procession to the Altar in sealed vessels by those asked by the stewards to do so.
- For Holy Communion, I will say 'The Body of Christ' to you once you have come forward in procession, leaving 1m between you and the next person, bowed and removed your face covering; please say 'Amen', after which I will place the Sacred Host in the palm of your hand for you to consume reverently before replacing your face covering and returning to your seat.
- Congregational singing, the sign of peace and the reception of the Precious Blood remain suspended, and I am grateful to all who leave their offertory collection and second collection in the baskets.
- I will no longer ask you to wear your face covering in the car park; unless you are exempt by law, you must continue to wear your face covering in our churches, and even in places where you are not obliged to wear it you may wish to do so to show that your neighbour's health means more to you than your comfort.

We must continue to observe social distancing, and remain alert to the needs, wellbeing and personal space of others, especially those who are feeling vulnerable or afraid. I will inform you as soon as possible of any other changes that we are able to make as and when we can make them in accordance with the Government's guidance and our own risk assessments. Please help me to help you keep you and all who gather with us as safe as possible, Fr Andrew

Marriage Certificates: A recent change in the law means that we can no longer issue civil marriage certificates. To obtain a certificate, please visit www.gov.uk/order-copy-birth-death-marriage-certificate; you can also contact the North East Lincolnshire Register Office (Cleethorpes Town Hall, Knoll Street, CLEETHORPES DN35 8LN / 01472 326295 / register.office@nelincs.gov.uk) to obtain birth, marriage, civil partnership and death certificates if they were registered in North East Lincolnshire. We will still issue Baptism, Confirmation and Marriage certificates from our parish registers for ecclesiastical purposes.

Posture during Mass: Anyone who feels unable to stand or kneel for any length of time during Mass is very, very welcome to sit if they prefer; similarly, anyone who feels unable to come to the Altar to receive Holy Communion should speak to a steward and they will arrange for me to come to them. The Sacrament of Baptism, in which we are born again as children of God, is the foundation of the Christian life, and in Baptism we are consecrated to share in Jesus' threefold Mission as Prophet, Priest and King. The next Covid-secure preparation course with Deacon Stephen will take place on Thursday 24th June at 7.00 pm in Holy Trinity Parish Hall. Parishioners who would like their children to be baptised should complete the form at the back of each church and return it to Fr Andrew at Mass; this can be done before the child has been born. Once the course has been completed, a date and time will be set for the Baptism.

Saint Mary on the Sea Church is once again open for private individual prayer from Tuesday to Friday between 9.00 am and 3.00 pm. Please sanitise your hands when you arrive and leave, and please either scan the QR code or fill in one of the attendance slips and post it through the presbytery letterbox.

Test & Trace: If you have the NHS Test & Trace app on your smartphone, please remember to use it when coming into our churches!

Pentecost: Jesus had already breathed the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles on the Day of Resurrection, but before he ascended into heaven he told them to wait in Jerusalem for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and today we celebrate the Day of Pentecost when the Holy Spirit came upon them 'like a powerful wind from heaven' and in what 'seemed like tongues of fire'; this Spirit overwhelmed them and they 'began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech'. The same Holy Spirit was poured into our hearts in Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation; it is by this same Holy Spirit that our offerings of bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ so that 'we, who are nourished by' Christ himself in the Blessed Eucharist, 'and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ'. And just like the Apostles on the Day of Pentecost, we too are sent out of our upper rooms to speak in a language that may seem foreign to many people, but which is the language that Jesus always speaks to us and wishes to speak through us – unconditional, self-sacrificing, all-inclusive, all-embracing and all-consuming love.
