**Hands – Face – Space – Fresh Air**

**Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity:** Trinity Sunday is the patronal feast of our parish, since we rejoice in our dedication to the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity, Almighty God in Godself, 'one God, one Lord: not in the unity of a single person, but in a Trinity of one substance,' the divine mystery which lives at the very heart of our faith. In the imperfection and inadequacies of human language and imagery, we express our understanding and experience of God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All people are made in God's image and, as Christians, we are baptised 'in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit': we are relational, personal, communal and equal in our unity, which is lived in the beauty of our diversity. Last Sunday, we heard how the Apostles, when they came out of the Upper Room, could proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ in a variety of languages in a recognition of the God-given diversity of the human race and wider creation; this Sunday, we can understand that that diversity is inherent to God in Godself – three wonderfully equal and diverse Persons intrinsically and fundamentally united as one God. God chose the rainbow as a symbol of the covenant with the whole creation for a reason, as it expresses in its colours the inclusiveness and in its shape the embrace of God's all-welcoming love for God's children and for all God has made. So let us ask the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit to bless our parish, our schools, our families and the wider community we are called to serve in our daily lives.

God raised Jesus up in the Spirit in his very self, and so in Jesus the Christ God raises us up, as disciples and apostles, co-responsible for the Church's mission as the presence of Christ in our community, so let us ask God for the grace to be the People of God, the body of Christ and the temple of the Holy Spirit, swimming in the sea of God's all-embracing and all-inclusive love, valuing all in the name of Jesus the Christ and being the people God has made us to be as an Easter People, with 'Alleluia' our song. May we always find more happiness in giving than in receiving, Fr Andrew

Toilet facilities are available for emergency use. All liturgies in St Mary on the

Sea Church are livestreamed. More information is available in each church, online and from the parish office.

From Corpus Christi, everyone is once again welcome to come to Eucharistic Adoration in person as well as online.
