Hands – Face – Space – Fresh Air

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for July: We pray that, in social, economic and political situations of conflict, we may be courageous and passionate architects of dialogue and friendship.

Cycle of Prayer: During the summer of Ordinary Time, we pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Celebrating Mass: Please visit massbooking.uk as early in the week as possible to book your place for Sunday Mass, contact the parish if you need assistance and remember to cancel your booking if you cannot come so that your seat can be reallocated. Admission to weekday Mass, other liturgical celebrations and private individual prayer is on a first come, first-served basis other than for funerals at which the church's maximum number applies and admission is by prior arrangement. Toilet facilities are available for emergency use. All liturgies in St Mary on the Sea Church are livestreamed. More information is available in each church, online and from the parish office.

First Holy Communion: Application forms for First Holy Communion in 2022 are available from the porch of each of our churches; parents of children who will be in Key Stage 2 or above in school year 2021-2022 who would like their children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Blessed Eucharist next year should complete an application form and hand it directly to Fr Andrew at the end of Mass by Sunday 12th September 2021. Parents whose children were on the programme in 2020-2021 and who have not completed their preparation will also need to complete the application form as there is no automatic re-registration.

Sea Sunday – 11th July 2021: This Sunday is Sea Sunday, when we will pray in a special way for all those who live and work at sea. There will be an appeal at each Mass for Stella Maris, the Church's official maritime agency and a second collection to help Stella Maris to be the 'star of the sea', providing practical and spiritual support for seafarers throughout the world, including here in our parish. Please pray for port chaplains and volunteers, including Steve, Bryony and all who support Stella Maris' work in Grimsby and Immingham, and seafarers throughout the world to whom we owe so much.

Lateral Flow Tests: North East Lincolnshire Council has asked us to become a distribution centre for lateral flow tests. Boxes are available from each of the churches when they are open for Mass or private prayer. Alternatively, contact the parish office to arrange collection. We fulfil our civic duties by being vaccinated, taking lateral flow tests, making sure we wear our face coverings when legal required, maintaining a social distance of 1m+ and sanitising our hands regularly. Moving Forward: England remains in Step 3 and, as was announced last Monday, is expected to move to step 4 on 19th July 2021; if this is confirmed in the coming days, I hope that I can give you more information in next week's *Sunday Message*. In the meantime:

- We should continue to minimise the number of people we meet within a short period of time to limit the risk of spreading Covid-19. If we meet family and friends, we can make a personal choice on whether to keep our distance from them, but HM Government continues to recommend that we be cautious. The wearing of face coverings continues to be mandatory in places of worship, and Covid-secure rules will continue to operate in our churches, the parish hall and St Mary's Presbytery. I am grateful to our stewards and those who manage our digital ministry for enabling us to gather for our Eucharistic Celebrations and me to exercise my ministry among you as your parish priest.
- I will always see parishioners in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, other care settings, their own homes or St Mary's Presbytery if they are seriously ill, or due to be admitted to hospital, and would like to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. You should not wait until someone's death is imminent before contacting me lest I be simply unable to visit someone who is sick or dying in good time. If you or a relative are in hospital, please ask a nurse to ask switchboard to contact the Catholic chaplain; if you or a relative are in other care settings, please ask a member of staff to contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holyltrinitygci.uk); if you or a relative are at home, please contact the parish office.
- I am endeavouring to visit parishioners, in accordance with Government guidance, who have been unable for some time to celebrate Mass in person and receive Holy Communion – if you are in this position, please do not assume that I know this as I do not have a crystal ball! To arrange a visit, please contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holyltrinitygci.uk) as I will be very happy to come to see you.
- We need to keep a record of the date, time and venue of all visits and meetings in case they are required by NHS Test and Trace.
- It is my intention that Masses on Sunday morning will remain at 9.00 am in Corpus Christi Church and 11.00 am in St Mary on the Sea Church. As for Saturday evening Mass, the options would be to celebrate one Mass in Our Lady Star of the Sea Church, as at present, or to celebrate two Masses, one in Our Lady Star of the Sea Church at 4.00 pm and one in Corpus Christi Church at 6.00 pm, or the other way around. If anyone has any thoughts about this, please contact me directly by next Sunday, 18th July.

As we move towards Step 4, there will be further changes, together with opportunities for us to reflect upon and celebrate who we are as the People of God here in our parish. Going forward, I believe that we must deepen our faith in Father, Son and Holy Spirit, in whose image we are made, so that we may be who we truly are. Fr Andrew
