Hands – Face – Space – Fresh Air

Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for August: We pray for the Church that she may receive from the Holy Spirit the grace and strength to reform herself in the light of the Gospel.

Cycle of Prayer: During the summer of Ordinary Time, we pray for: a deeper understanding between Christians and Jews; those who suffer persecution, oppression & the denial of human rights; Europe; human life; and seafarers. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and all whose anniversaries occur at this time.

CARE (Christian Action & Resource Enterprise) is a charity located in North East Lincolnshire, dedicated to relieving poverty, hardship, and distress to those in need in the local community and passionate about bringing dignity and compassion into the lives of those who for some reason find themselves at a point of need, primarily those who are marginalised, vulnerable and disadvantaged, particularly economically and socially. Including our recent second collection and a parishioner's generous offer to match the total of that collection pound-for-pound up to £400.00, this July we have contributed £1000.00 to support CARE's support of emergency food provision for the vulnerable and needy within our community. CARE has moved away from providing bags of food to people to issuing food vouchers, which means that individuals have to physically make the effort to shop for themselves and choose the food they will eat; this been well received and the people themselves have told us that they prefer this as they feel this is a more dignified method that restores some of their self-worth. If you were unable to celebrate Mass in person when the collection was taken but would like to donate towards CARE's work, please contact the parish office. Celebrating Mass: Everyone who wishes to come to Sunday Mass should book a seat online at www.massbooking.uk; those who do not have access to the internet can telephone St Mary's Presbytery during office hours to book a place – telephone bookings cannot be taken after Fridays at 3.00 pm. Anyone who does not book a place can be admitted provided that there is space. QR codes are clearly signposted at the entrances of our churches, and everyone who has the NHS app installed on their smartphone should use them; alternatively, stewards will take your name and contact number. There is no need to book for weekday Mass, but you should sign in. Please **sanitise your hands** when you come into the church, **wear your face covering inside the church**, unless you are exempt for medical reasons, take a '**Please leave a space**' card and place it next to you on your bench if you would prefer a space to be left to allow for social distancing, and **exercise good responsible behaviour** when moving around the church and avoid getting too close to other people.

First Holy Communion: Application forms for First Holy Communion in 2022 are available from the porch of each of our churches; parents of children who will be in Key Stage

2 or above in school year 2021-2022 who would like their children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and the Blessed Eucharist next year should complete an application form and hand it directly to Fr Andrew at the end of Mass by Sunday 12th September 2021. Parents whose children were on the programme in 2020-2021 and who have not completed their preparation will also need to complete the application form as there is no automatic re-registration.

Lateral Flow Tests: North East Lincolnshire Council has asked us to become a distribution centre for lateral flow tests. Boxes are available from each of the churches when they are open for Mass or private prayer. We fulfil our civic duties by being vaccinated, taking lateral flow tests, making sure we wear our face coverings, respecting others' personal space and sanitising our hands regularly, as all these things are practical expressions of the new commandment, 'Fr Andrew

Pastoral Visits: England is now in Step Four of the easing of lockdown. COVID-19 will be a feature of our lives for the foreseeable future, so we need to learn to live with it and manage the risk to ourselves and others. As COVID-19 restrictions are lifted, it is important that we all use personal judgement to manage our own risk. All of us can play our part by exercising common sense and considering the risks. While no situation is risk free, there are actions we can take to protect ourselves and others around us. Following this guidance will help you stay safe and protect others by controlling the spread. Every action to help reduce the spread will reduce any further resurgence of the virus in the coming months. The Government expects and recommends that people wear face coverings in crowded areas, being outside or letting fresh air in, and minimising the number, proximity and duration of social contacts. I will always see parishioners in the Diana Princess of Wales Hospital, other care settings, their own homes or in St Mary's Presbytery if they are seriously ill, or due to be admitted to hospital, and would like to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick, but other regular pastoral visits by me and by other ministers in our parish remain suspended. You should not wait until someone's death is imminent before contacting me lest I be simply unable to visit someone who is sick or dying in good time. If you or a relative are in hospital, please ask a nurse to ask switchboard to contact the Catholic chaplain as it is not currently possible to visit wards without permission; if you or a relative are in other care settings, please ask a member of staff to contact the parish office (01472 342301; office@holytrinitygci.uk); if you or a relative are at home, please contact the parish office. We need to keep a record of all such visits in case details are required by NHS Test and Trace. Thank you for your cooperation, which keeps us all safe. Fr Andrew
