**Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for September:** We pray that we all will make courageous choices for a simple and environmentally sustainable lifestyle, rejoicing in our young people who are resolutely committed to this.

**Cycle of Prayer:** During the autumn of Ordinary Time, we pray for: the harvest, the fruits of human work and the reverent use of Creation; students and teachers; the spread of the Gospel; justice and peace in the world; prisoners and their families; all victims of war; and young people. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

**CAFOD Harvest Family Fast Day – 1<sup>st</sup> October 2021:** This Friday is Family Fast Day, when we are asked to go without a meal to support people around the world who are dedicating their lives to protecting God's creation. To donate online, please visit [cafod.org.uk/give](http://cafod.org.uk/give); alternatively, please take a collection envelope and place it in the collection box next weekend.

**Celebrating Mass:** Please arrive in good time for Mass. The doors and windows of our churches must be left open before, during and after Mass to help reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, so please wear warm clothing when coming into our churches and bring a cushion and water with you if you need them for your comfort. Toilet facilities are available and should be cleaned immediately by those using them. If you have the NHS COVID-19 app installed on your smartphone, you can help prevent the spread of coronavirus by scanning the QR code in each church. Please continue to exercise personal and social responsibility by wearing your face coverings, sanitising your hands using the automatic hand sanitiser dispensers, and taking care when entering, moving around and leaving our churches. 'Please leave a space' cards are available for those who wish to use them. If you are feeling unwell, please stay home and celebrate Mass online.

**COVID-19** remains a serious health risk, as does seasonal flu and other transmissible viruses. As we head into the winter months, the Government is still advising us to stay cautious to help protect ourselves and others, to let fresh air in if we meet indoors, to meet outdoors if possible because it is safer, to wear a face covering in crowded and enclosed spaces where we come into contact with people you do not normally meet, and to get vaccinated if we have not already done so. We should get tested and self-isolated if required. People over 50, care home residents, health and social care workers, and those aged 16 to 49 years with severely weakened immune systems will be offered a third COVID-19 vaccine dose this Autumn. The doors and windows of our churches will remain open during our liturgical celebrations, and we should continue to wear our face coverings, unless we cannot for health reasons, and sanitise our hands; let us continue to do all that we can to protect ourselves and others as these measures are a practical expression of Jesus' 'new commandment: "love one another, just as I have loved you"' (*John 13:34*).
