**Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for October:** We pray that every baptised person may be engaged in evangelisation, available to the mission, by being witnesses of a life that has the flavour of the Gospel.

**Cycle of Prayer:** During the autumn of Ordinary Time, we pray for: the harvest, the fruits of human work and the reverent use of Creation; students and teachers; the spread of the Gospel; justice and peace in the world; prisoners and their families; all victims of war; and young people. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

**CAFOD:** There will be a second collection this weekend to support CAFOD's mission of reaching out to people living in poverty with practical help, whatever their religion or culture, and campaigning for global justice, so that every woman, man and child can live a full and dignified life.

**Celebrating Mass:** Please arrive in good time for Mass. The doors and windows of our churches must be left open before, during and after Mass to help reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, so please wear warm clothing when coming into our churches and bring a cushion and water with you if you need them for your comfort. Toilet facilities are available and should be cleaned immediately by those using them. If you have the NHS COVID-19 app installed on your smartphone, you can help prevent the spread of coronavirus by scanning the QR code in each church. Please continue to exercise personal and social responsibility by wearing your face coverings, sanitising your hands using the automatic hand sanitiser dispensers, and taking care when entering, moving around and leaving our churches. 'Please leave a space' cards are available for those who wish to use them. If you are feeling unwell, please stay home and celebrate Mass online.

**Our Christmas Draw** gives us an opportunity to raise much needed funds for our parish thereby enabling us to implement our Vision. please support the draw, which will take place on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> November:

**Environmental Justice:** means 'recognising and defending Earth itself and all its non-human inhabitants as we challenge the climate emergency'; Sr Bridgetta will speak to us at each Mass this weekend on what we can do to promote environmental justice.

**Holy Communion:** In accordance with guidance issued by the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, Holy

Communion will continue to be distributed under one kind, the Sacred Host, and only the Celebrant and any concelebrants will consume the Precious Blood. All ministers of Holy Communion will continue to sanitise their hands before distributing Holy Communion and will wear a face covering whilst so doing. The Bishops' Conference continues to recommend that Holy Communion is received in the hand. In our parish, those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue during Mass may do so, but they should come to me at the end of the procession in order that I may more easily manage any risk of contamination. Thank you for your cooperation, which keeps us all safe, as we celebrate Mass and receive Holy Communion with dignity and devotion. Fr Andrew

**LGBT+ Pastoral Ministry Mass – 23<sup>rd</sup> October 2021:** To demonstrate and share the Good News of God's love for all, Bishop Patrick has set up a pastoral ministry to support LGBT+ people (a term which includes those who describe themselves as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender or any other queer identity), their families and friends, providing an opportunity to gather together from across the Diocese in different parishes to celebrate Mass and their membership of the Church. As part of this pastoral ministry, Bishop Patrick will be visiting our parish on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> October to celebrate Mass at 1.00 pm in Corpus Christi Church, I hope that as many as possible will join me in welcoming Bishop Patrick and our LGBT+ sisters and brothers, their families and friends, who will journey from across the Diocese and beyond. Mass will be preceded by Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Reconciliation from 12.15 pm and will be followed by light refreshments in Holy Trinity Parish Hall. Gathering to celebrate Mass will express our Prophetic Mission, because we will proclaim the all-embracing and all-inclusive love of God, our Priestly Mission, because we will offer Mass together with our Bishop and fellow Christians from across our Diocese, and our Kingly Mission, because we will have the opportunity to welcome and get to know those who join us.
