We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick & housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's & St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Celebrating Mass: Please arrive in good time for Mass. The doors and windows of our churches must be left open before, during and after Mass to help reduce the risk of transmission of COVID-19, so please wear warm clothing when coming into our churches and bring a cushion and water with you if you need them for your comfort. Toilet facilities are available and should be cleaned immediately by those using them. If you have the NHS COVID-19 app installed on your smartphone, you can help prevent the spread of coronavirus by scanning the QR code in each church. Please continue to exercise personal and social responsibility by wearing your face coverings, sanitising your hands using the automatic hand sanitiser dispensers, and taking care when entering, moving around and leaving our churches. 'Please leave a space' cards are available for those who wish to use them. If you are feeling unwell, please stay home and celebrate Mass online.
