Pope Francis' Prayer Intention for January: We pray for all those suffering from religious discrimination and persecution; may their own rights and dignity be recognised, which originate from being brothers and sisters in the human family.

Cycle of Prayer: During the winter of Ordinary Time, we pray for: peace on earth; Christian unity; victims of human trafficking; the sick and those who care for them; and the unemployed. We also pray for Fr Colum, the sick and housebound of our parish, the mission of St Mary's and St Joseph's schools, and those whose anniversaries occur at this time.

Baptism Preparation: The next preparation course take place in Corpus Christi Church this Thursday, 20th January, at 7.00 pm. Parishioners who would like their children to be baptised should complete the form at the back of each church and return it to Fr Andrew at Sunday Mass; this can be done before the child has been born. Once the course has been completed, a date and time will be set for the Baptism.

Peace Sunday – 16th January 2022: This Sunday is being observed as Peace Sunday in England and Wales, when we are invited to reflect on Pope Francis' Message for the 55th World Day of Peace, 'Dialogue between generations, education and work: tools for building lasting peace.' The need for peace in the world is obvious. People are struggling against violence and conflict, growing inequalities, the effects of climate change and the ongoing Covid pandemic. How can we harness the gifts and energy of all generations in the work of peace-making? Which 'tools for building lasting peace' do we think Pope Francis might be talking about? In this country, we have an active Catholic peace movement in Pax Christi, which does a great deal of good work to promote peace and nonviolence through parishes, schools and social media; their website

Reading at Mass: We are looking for new readers, a wonderful ministry which enables the Word of God to be proclaimed in our churches. If you read before lockdown, or if you have never read but would like to, please see Fr Andrew. Training will be provided!

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – 18th-25th January 2022: Materials for this year's Week of Prayer have been prepared by Christians from the Middle East, who have taken as their theme: 'We saw his star in the east' (*Matthew 2:2*). The history of the Middle East is characterised by conflict and strife, tainted with blood and darkened by injustice and oppression, and the Christians of the Middle East offer these resources conscious that the world shares many of the travails and much of the difficulties that they experience, and yearns for a light to lead the way to the Saviour who is the light that overcomes darkness. The story of the Magi visiting the Holy Family in very familiar to us. They have sometimes been seen as a symbol of the world's diversity – different religions and cultures – coming to adore Jesus the Christ, and so the story points towards the unity that God desires. Living the Gospel today requires a commitment to all people, especially the poorest, weakest and marginalised, requiring transparency and accountability from Churches and ecclesial communities in all their activities, and cooperation in providing relief to the afflicted, welcome to the displaced, relief to the burdened, and to building a just and honest society. This is a call for Christians to work together so that young people can build a good future according to God's heart, a future in which all human beings can experience life, peace, justice, and love.
