Bishop Patrick has appointed Fr Andrew as a member of the Chapter of St Barnabas' Cathedral, in 'worthy recognition of your years of service as a priest in our diocese and the responsibilities you currently carry out' in our parish and in the Diocese of Nottingham of which it is a part. He will be installed as a canon in St Barnabas' Cathedral on Wednesday 7th December, along with Frs John Kyne, Matthew Jakes and Peter Vellacott as chapter canons and Frs Stephen Dye and Stanley Ofoegbu as honorary canons. Amongst other duties, the Chapter celebrates solemn liturgical functions in the Cathedral and advises the Bishop in exercise of his pastoral office as proper pastor of our diocese.
