The Season of Christmas begins on Christmas Eve and takes us through the Octave of Christmas to the Solemnities of Mary, the Holy Mother of God on Sunday 1st January 2023, and the Epiphany of the Lord on Friday 6th January, until the season concludes on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord on Sunday 8th January, and we begin Ordinary Time. The longer Christmastide takes us to the fortieth day after Christmas, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord on 2nd February, Candlemas Day, when the Cribs and Christmas trees in our churches are taken down as the light of Christ, given to us in Baptism, is once again handed on to be spread far and wide. Christmas Day is the beginning of Christmas – not the end of it, contrary to what our neighbours and newspapers may say! Our longer celebration enables us to reclaim Christmas for our Lord Jesus Christ, Emmanuel, God-is-with-us, who 'is the same yesterday, today and for ever' (*Hebrews 13:8*).
