CAFOD: Friday's Harvest Family Fast Day gives us the opportunity to support people in parts of the world which have been badly affected by the ongoing climate emergency, famine, flooding and other natural disasters. In the last year, the Northern Lincolnshire Deanery, of which our parish is a part and Fr Andrew is Dean, funded the equivalent of 25 healthcare units and emergency shelter for 692 people, and none of it would be possible without our support. There will be an appeal and retiring collection for CAFOD this weekend; please give your offering to the collectors as you leave Mass, give your offering via the contactless giving or start a monthly gift to CAFOD by visiting cafod.org.uk/fastday If you are a UK taxpayer, when you donate to CAFOD and fill in a Gift Aid form, you can increase the value of your gift by 25p for every £1.00 you give – at no extra cost to you! A gift of £10.00, for example, becomes £12.50, and the extra 25% on your gift makes a big difference and means that CAFOD can support local experts with additional funding. Covid-19: While the Government advises those who have Covid to stay home if they can, there is no legal requirement to self-isolate if you or anyone in your household has Covid, just as there is not if you have a cold or the flu. The NHS advises

that 'vaccination is effective and the safest way to protect yourself from' Covid, and the NHS will contact you if your record shows you are eligible – I have already had my Covid and flu jabs, and I would encourage everyone to do so.
